





Haiti Mission Trip May 28 – June 5, 2016



Q & A with Shawna Mitchell

Q: We know the orphans of Haiti have a special place in your heart, with your family currently in the adoption process to adopt children from Haiti. You previously went on a mission trip to Haiti with a group, but with the upcoming trip you will be a mission leader. Is that correct and what will your role be?

A: Yes, I will be the mission trip leader for the team going to Haiti. I will be coordinating the trip with a representative from America World Adoption Association.

Q: You will be attending church on this trip. Did you attend church during your last trip and if so, what was that experience like?

A: Yes, I did attend church when I was there last May. The church I went to was ran by a group of American Missionaries. The music was in the native language but the Pastor spoke in English with a translator. It was an amazing experience to worship with other believers in another part of the world.

Q: What do you look forward to most about this trip?

A: For me, I'm excited about going back. I fell in love when I was there, the people, the culture, the history, the sights and the sounds. I also look forward to seeing the children. We all know the statistics about orphans and the need to help them, but when you have one of them hold your hand and look up at you with this raw unconditional love, it's like a mirror image of your relationship with God. I look forward to others experiencing this for themselves.

Q: For someone who is considering going with you what can they expect to learn and experience?

A: For someone who is considering going they can expect to gain a broader perspective of how God is at work in the world beyond our own borders. When you watch a strong woman with no shoes on walk down the road carrying water on her head to take to her family, in that moment, you see what is really important. You begin to see what true needs are. When you are there and you can stop and take a moment, look around, you realize how much we really need God.

Q: What are the costs of this trip, per person?

A: \$2,300 to \$2,500

Q: I have heard that obtaining a passport takes quite some time longer than previously. Is a passport required or will a travel Visa be sufficient?

A: Yes, a passport is required.

Q: What is the deadline date within which to commit to going on this trip?

A: My deadline is March 15th. That is so you can make sure you have everything you need to go like your passport, shots, funds, etc. AWAA will let you sign up to go till the end of April, but you will need to have everything in order for your trip.

Q: You will be collecting supplies and medicines to take on this trip. What is needed and where can the items be delivered?

A: Yes, we will be collecting supplies. I am currently working with AWAA to get a detailed list for the Orphanages we will be working at. Most of the items are like children's Tylenol and cough medicines. Diapers, wipes, crayons, markers, deflated balls, blankets, and toys are all needed. I will be putting out a detailed list as soon as I get it but if you would like to go ahead and donate you may bring it to the church or contact me and I will pick it up.

Q: If someone would like to contribute monetarily towards this trip, how is the best way to make a contribution?

A: If someone would like to donate please just drop a check in the offering box at the church and put in the memo line that it is for the Haiti trip. If they would like to donate to someone's account that is going on the trip, they just need to write their name on it also. We will be doing a Yard Sale fundraiser in April so if you would like to donate items for that you can see myself or James.

Q: Is there anything else you would like to share about the trip?

A: Please be in prayer for this trip and its team members.

Why Should We Care About Church?

The Scriptures, from first to last, teach that the Christian life is to be lived within the context of a family of faith. The Bible knows nothing of Lone Ranger Christians. Far from being born again as some kind of rugged individualist, we're born into a body of believers (1 Cor 12:13), of which the Lord Jesus Christ is the head. Hebrews tells us that we should not give up meeting together (10:23-25).

Spiritual growth is simply impossible apart from membership in a healthy, well-balanced church. It's the church through which we receive the Word and the ordinances as a means of grace, and therefore it's crucial that we emulate the early Christians who devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship and to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

While it is in the church that we enter into worship, experience fellowship and are equipped to witness, church attendance itself, of course, does not save us. Walking into a church doesn't make you a Christian any more than walking into a garage makes you a car. We're rescued from God's wrath, forgiven of all our sins and declared righteous before God solely by grace through faith on account of Jesus Christ alone.

I'm not urging you to go to church so that you can become a Christian, but as a Christian you need to be part of a healthy, well-balanced church because God has ordained this as the vehicle through which we could worship Him, through which we could experience oneness with one another, and through which we can be equipped to go out and impact the world.

3 lbs boneless, trimmed, butterfly pork chops 2 cans low fat Cream of Chicken Soup 1 package dry Ranch dressing mix 1 c. water 1/2 c. chopped onion 1 package fresh, sliced Shiitake mushrooms 1 T olive oil

Lightly brown pork chops in olive oil in a skillet. Combine Ranch dressing mix, water and soup. Place pork chops, onion and mushrooms in crock pot. Pour soup mixture over the top. Cook on low for 4 to 6 hours. It makes its own gravy. Serve over rice.
