

The Umbrella Command v1 Don't Judge Others Hypercritically or Hypocritically (Like the Pharisees)

Do not judge so that you will not be judged

Modern America's Favorite Verse is Misunderstood

To "see" Matthew 7:1 as a prohibition against any/all MVJ (moral value judgments) ignores the overall biblical context, ignores the immediate biblical context of this statement and incorrectly reads a generic meaning into a specific statement about how disciples of Jesus are to make +R moral value judgments

This is similar to Philippians 4:8 which is not describing WHAT Christians can/should think about but rather describing HOW Christians can/should think about everything (good or bad) that they think about (drunk driving, assault and battery, bank robbery, bullying, cheating on tests).

The Two Specific Qualifications (to the Command of Matthew 7:1) IOWs: Two Things To Avoid as DOJ Make +R Moral Judgments v2-5

<u>1: Don't Judge Others Hypercritically (Like the Pharisees) v2</u> For in the way you judge, you will be judged; and by your standard of measure, it will be measured to you.

IOWs: When We Make MVJs (Moral Value Judgments) We Must Remember Our Own Personal Accountability to God

Sometimes, we can demand MORE of others, than we expect of ourselves Human beings (Christians and Non-Christians) (Your Name) tend to be much more aware of the "weaknesses/faults" of others than we are of our own real weaknesses/faults. AND research shows we tend to attribute our successes to inner virtues within ourselves but blame our failures on dynamics outside our control.

Christian Parenting 101: don't let your kids think you believe or project the appearance of believing that they can do no wrong and when they "do" it is always somebody's fault....such that if they don't make the team it must be the coach's fault, if they don't make good grades it must be the teacher's fault and if they have legal problems it must be the policeman's fault, if they have moral problems it must be the Church's fault (usually the Pastor or the Youth Minister).

2: Don't Judge Others Hypocritically Like the Pharisees v3-5

Why do you look at the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? ⁴ Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' and behold, the log is in your own eye? ⁵ You hypocrite! First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.

IOWs: When We Make MVJs (Moral Value Judgments)

We Must Remember Our Own Personal Weaknesses/Issues and the Fact That As Much Fun as Being a Self-Appointed Spiritual Fruit Inspector for Others of Our Choosing Is....God's Intent is for Each of Us to Make Our Own Sweet Selves Our #1 Spiritual Science Project (and to Realize That is Essentially a Full Time Job).

Take This To Heart

In light of the greatness of God's grace in saving us, believers in Jesus should be gracious people, slow to take offense and quick to forgive (love smothers a multitude of transgressions...it doesn't pile on or fan the flames).

However, in a fallen world (to which we have made personal contributions) we MUST make (righteous/godly) moral value judgments all the time. And yet we also must do the right thing(s)...the right way(s).

When we make moral value judgments about others we should be careful to avoid being hypercritical and/or hypocritical. Rather than looking like the selfrighteous "Church Lady" believers should look more like the Lord Jesus Christ in interacting with others even those with serious moral issues (think Jesus and the woman at the well & Jesus and Nicodemus the self-righteous but eternally insecure religious unbeliever.


The application of the teaching of Matthew 7:1-5 would make the witness of Christians in Modern America substantially more effective. At the very beginning of TSOTM our Lord said: "Blessed are those who mourn..."
IOWs: instead of the evil in us and around us primarily making us mad, disciples of Jesus should primarily see it as sad. This will help us to react to people living in a culture in spiritual/moral freefall with saddened/broken hearts instead of angry/hostile hearts-and catalyze us to live consistently with/share clearly with our lips and our lives God's amazing grace in Jesus Christ.


One thing I don't like about Christianity is that Christians are so *judgmental* even though Jesus said *not to judge anyone ever*.


