JUST THE FACTS

Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness and longsuffering; Bearing with one another and forgiving one another; if anyone has a complaint against another, even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which you were called in one body; and be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatever you do in word or deed do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

With eight decades in the rearview mirror, Jean (also known as Miss Jean, Just Jean, Aunt Jean) shows no sign of slowing down her physical drive or dimming that positive light we all look forward to experiencing when we see her.

Jean King was born to Gladys (Griffith) and L.L. King. A 'middle sister' to Pat, Kathy, Jim and Donna, Jean grew up in a no-frills neighborhood of Oklahoma City. To describe her childhood in a few words, Jean says "we were poor"! (As were many hardworking families in that era.) It's hard to imagine Jean letting that dampen her spirits in those years, but I've also heard her say she found plenty of mischief to get into.

Jean has frequently mentioned how she would have benefited from having a mentor in her youth. She states one of her greatest regrets in life was that of failing to grasp the importance of honoring other humans' life choices, giving value to every person and allowing them to be who they were. "I tended to want to change them into what I thought they should be, said Jean, "I know now that I was the loser for doing this."

Jean doesn't dwell a lot on her early adult years, except to say her daughter Glenna Jean was born August 13, 1962. Glenna, who now resides in Denver with her husband Michael Donahue, and grandchildren Conner and Lauren are a great source of blessing and delight in Jean's life.

Around 1970, Jean met her future husband Bob Schalit while she was working at the Sheraton Inn near Will Rogers Airport. He was an aircraft broker, a vocation that would take them to Albuquerque, Fort Lauderdale, Oklahoma City, Arkansas and a long stint in Everglades City, FL where Jean eventually tired of the "all the same" weather seasons and persuaded Bob to move back to Duncan. Soon after that move Jean, along with some of her family members, opened an outstanding restaurant called Cousins, located first in the Clear Creek / Lake Humphreys vicinity, then in Duncan near the corner of 8th & Willow.

While Jean's "regular life" has plenty of twists and turns, her introduction to organized religion and eventual acceptance of Jesus as her Lord and Savior are not only interesting, but in part may explain her zest for life.

At an early age, Jean's experiences of visiting church with neighbors were pleasant - one neighbor couple even offered her a candy bar for visiting! At age 12, she was baptized, though failing to grasp the meaning of this ordinance. Her grandmother later insisted she be baptized into the Pentecostal Church, but this experience also failed to reflect a true conversion.

The move to Duncan proved providential in her true conversion. One of the founding members of Tanglewood, Martha Ratliff, entertained at Cousins restaurant on a regular basis, and invited Jean to visit TBF. "I wanted to study the Bible as literature, cause it was HARD to understand", Jean says, "but all I heard when I went to church was about Jesus, and I just didn't get that - yet."

Then came August 20, 1986, one of those days that started out normal enough, but soon filled our lives with despair when news of the Edmond post office shooting broke. Jean heard an emotional testimony given by a woman who lost her daughter on this day. The woman described having a peace in her heart, even though she just KNEW her daughter was dead. This testimony compelled Jean to return to church and learn how on earth a person could find peace in such a tragedy. After phoning TBF to learn the time services were to begin, and having Tom O'Dell tell her "it's never too late to come", she journeyed to church where Tom spent time with her one on one while others were in service, and led her to place her trust in Christ as her personal Savior.

Jean was baptized (for real this time!) in Clear Creek Lake in October of that year, and began her service at TBF a few years later when a teacher was needed for Son Shine kids. (Stephanie Skinner West and Angie Miller were some of those 'kids' she first taught.)

Looking back, Jean points toward the end of WWII, the assassination of JFK, and the horrific loss of life when the Twin Towers came down as the greatest historic or world changing events she recalls. She has also witnessed tremendous change in freedoms and rights for our African American brothers and sisters.

Of course, there have been tremendous strides in technology impacting her life as well, going from a rotary dial telephone, to having a pacemaker implanted that magically sends data to doctors in Oklahoma City. Jean takes full advantage of new advancements in technology, kicking cable to the curb a few years ago, now using Netflix, etc. and communicating on the World Wide Web with friends and family far and wide.

In terms of less positive changes in our society, Jean points to the way the world views Christianity. "Not in a good way" she states, "and the way the churches themselves have changed, such as the style of music, PowerPoint lyrics overhead replacing the choirs and hymnals".

Things I miss most......

Good manners

Pop music that was uplifting and romantic.

Holidays at my parents' house with my family.

Flying for hours with Bob piloting a small aircraft as he sang and knew all the lyrics from so many songs from about the 50's and back.

Of course my ability to do physical things such as ride my bike for hours, I haven't given up on doing that again!

Some 33 years following her conversion experience, Jean continues her service to TBF and shares her love of Christ and love for life with all who come into her sphere of influence. Looking forward, Jean's one great remaining wish for her life, is that of knowing that all her friends and family have been saved and will join her in heaven one day. "I'd really like to share the Christian life with them here on earth for a while", she says. Jean did have the joy of seeing her husband, Bob profess faith in Christ at age 80, just a few years before he left her side in 2008.

Advice to the younger generation: People my age are still here, even though we can't do what we used to do. We still want to contribute, we want to be seen, included, and considered relevant. We still have a sense of humor and love being included in outings not just with other singles, but being asked to join married couples.

Warm Chicken Salad

Serves 2

Dressing: 1/8 c vinegar; 1/4 c fresh lime juice; 2 t cumin; 1 t fresh chopped Serrano pepper without seeds and deveined; 1/4 c minced cilantro; 1 t minced garlic; and 1/8 t sugar. Blend on med-high for about 20-30 seconds; add 1/4 c olive oil and blend on low for about 10 seconds. Add salt and pepper to taste.

HOT chicken salad: 3 large skinless, boneless chicken thighs, stewed and cut into cubes; 1 onion cut like for fajitas; 2 small zucchini thin-sliced; and 1 c sliced button mushrooms. Heat 1 T canola oil in large skillet and add onion, zucchini and mushrooms and saute until all vegetables are tender; add chicken and heat through. Mix together with dressing.

Serve in baked flour tortilla bowls.

To make tortilla bowls: Coat a flour tortilla with cooking spray and shape on an inverted oven safe bowl, such as a cereal bowl. Place inverted bowls on baking sheet and bake at 375 degrees until lightly brown, but not too crisp, for about 10-15 minutes.

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
