A pastoral career spanning 37 years, involving positions at only two churches could sound a bit ho hum (although it is a HUGE accomplishment), but a bit of digging does reveal more than a few interesting twists and turns in the lives of Brad and Debbie McCoy.

From the time of Brad's salvation experience at age 9, he always believed if you were truly a sold out Christian, you would be either a pastor or a missionary. But, hey, he was nine and even really bright guys don't generally have total life plans at that age, right? And besides, he really needed to focus on creating some havoc in the life of his 3 younger sisters. So, life seemingly rolled along while behind the scenes God played out his plan to bring him back around to a life dedicated to Biblical teaching.

Brad got to be one of the cool kids who lived in three different states growing up. His Dad's work in the oil storage business took them from Florida, through Alabama, settling in Nederland, Texas, for his high school years where he met Debbie Walker. (She was the lucky girl who spent all her early years in Nederland growing up with 2 sisters). Getting to know each other originally in high school English class their first 'date' was to the library in Port Arthur to do research for senior term papers (so exciting - you can't make this stuff up!)

Finding themselves "immediately extremely compatible", they stayed in touch when they went separate directions for college studies - Brad to University of Houston / Lamar University for a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology, Debbie to Tyler Junior College to pursue a Dental Hygiene certification.

Married in 1973, Debbie began work with a Houston dentist, while Brad entered Dental School. They found a church home at a small Bible church in Houston where Brad's desire to be the "sold out guy" who shared his love for Christ and brought others to faith was rekindled. Plugging into service there, first in teaching children, he then found himself facing a small group of adults eagerly awaiting his words of wisdom. Unfortunately, the Brad McCoy of 1976 was not the Brad of 2019 who on the outside sometimes appears to be calm, cool and self-assured. Experiencing a high level of anxiety, he describes basically a Class A miracle of becoming totally calm and able to share what he had learned in his week of preparation after a short opening prayer during which his knees were literally knocking!

Not too long after that incredible experience, Brad developed some eye sight issues which forced him to consider a change in career direction. His focus returned to that love for Christ, and the desire to learn more about his Savior and being able to share what he learned with others. During a weekend camping trip with her family, Debbie found a calm assurance that seminary was the right direction for them. Four more years of school with her working to support them, right? No doubt she truly did receive some supernatural affirmation and encouragement.

Brad describes his time at Dallas Theological Seminary as the "sweet spot" in life, at least up to that point in time. Investing in books that earlier would have been a huge luxury and knowing this was now "his job" to read, digest and master the content was a challenge he not only fully embraced, but enjoyed. He chewed through classes with the likes of Drs. Harold Hoehner, Charles Ryrie and Robert Lightner. These were brilliant Godly men who were not household names at that time, but have come to be widely accepted as having accomplished important work in the field of theology. Brad loved seminary so much, he crammed 4 years of study into 3, anxious to get to the work God had ready for them. But alas, God had another time table. . . .

Anxiously waiting through 15 months to find the church for that all important first pastoral position also brought some interesting experiences. Their son Jamie was born in June after Brad's May 1981 graduation, so while Debbie adjusted to the new Mom role, Brad found work at a law firm in Dallas. They trekked to Louisiana, Alabama, Texas and flew into Nebraska in a BLIZZARD in January looking for the place God would have them serve.

Ultimately, they found the right fit at Fellowship Bible Church of Shreveport, Louisiana, in August of 1982. FBC is described by both Brad and Debbie as a "good first church." God added son Jonathan to their family the next February, and they were also blessed to form many lasting friendships during this time. Although there were ministry challenges, they saw spiritual growth in the church and God brought enough encouragement to keep them going in the early years. The move to Tanglewood did not come about as a result of a normal pastoral search, at least not from the McCoy's end. Brad actually received what you might call a "cold call" from Bill Dickinson on a Sunday afternoon, asking him to consider looking at TBF as his next position based on a recommendation by Robert Lightner. Headed to DFW for a theological conference over fall break in October, 1988, they agreed to stop in for a visit at TBF where Brad spoke on Acts 2:42. And, as they say. . . the rest is history - well, almost history at this point. With the current average pastoral tenure being about 3 years, both TBFers and the McCoys would say it has truly been a great gift for them to minister in this one church for 31 years. That blessing included raising their children in Duncan, with Debbie able to commit to full time "mom-ship" until shortly after Jamie graduated high school in 1999. At that time, she entered the Duncan Public School system, first as a substitute teacher, then spent 18 years serving in the office as Financial Secretary at Horace Mann Elementary.

Over thirty-one years of ministry a lot of things happen, a lot of things change, and others remain the same. One thing that remained the same was Brad and Debbie's quiet commitment to servant leadership at TBF and in our community. To highlight some changes, Brad counts the completion of the "new building" (current auditorium, foyer, kitchen and education rooms) in 1991 as one of the exciting times of his tenure.

Looking back over the years, TBF's connection with Carmen and Tomas Yanez and the Jerusalem Baptist Church in Puebla, Mexico is another special blessing Brad reflects on fondly. Although TBF had always been a church closely tied to the needs of mission work, be that local or across the globe, the first official mission trip involving TBFers including Brad to Puebla, Mexico also occurred in 1991. Since that time, about 40 different TBFers have traveled to Mexico, assisting Carmen & Car

Brad was awarded his PhD in Biblical Studies in 2003, climbing that four-year mountain with the primary intent of being able to research and write a dissertation on the unique literary structure of the Prologue and the Epilogue of the Book of Revelation. While the increased Biblical knowledge he gained in his doctoral program has served him and TBF well, it also ultimately led to a part-time teaching position at Cameron University, primarily at the Duncan Branch. Since January of 2004, he has been able to assist students of various ages with overcoming that fear of public speaking, he understood so well. In addition to teaching basic communications classes, Brad has also been able to expand his sphere of Biblical teaching and influence through this position, teaching classes such as The Bible as Literature (for both Old and New Testament), and World Religions.

After many years of contemplation and with the assistance of the Elder Board and church body, Brad and Debbie made their first visit to Israel in 1999. They immediately recognized the great impact such trips could have on other Christians. He and Debbie count these travels to Israel (3 tours), Greece, Turkey, China and three teaching stints in Jordan as extra special blessings that came their way as a "bonus" of pastoring at Tanglewood.

As they transition to retirement, of course Brad and Debbie look forward to spending quality time with their 7 grandchildren. Brad also hopes to do some technical writing for professional journals and delve into some of those books on the shelf - this time more for his own learning purposes and pleasure. Debbie dreams of getting to Switzerland or Paris - even if it's Paris, Texas!

Brad and Debbie leave with us these parting words of wisdom: remember not to "doubt, pout and drop out!" In the 31 years we have been here, Tanglewood has seen many ups and downs including "droughts" in one demographic area or another. Some of you will recall some pretty drastic downturns with Halliburton layoffs that were painful when multiple families left us, yet here we are today with other families who have not only joined us in attendance, but in service. Never doubt the value of simply consistently showing up for church as a positive and plugged in and contributor to the ongoing ministry of TBF. Remember also to make it a point to "catch people doing the right thing(s)." Also, to be eager to do what you can to meet the needs of the overall church and individual TBFers.





#### **Creamy Chicken and Rice Casserole**

- 1 box Chicken-flavor Rice-A-Roni (6 Ounce Box)
- 1 can Cream of Mushroom Soup (10 Ounce Can)
- 1 container Sour Cream (8 Ounce Size)
- 1 whole Rotisserie Chicken
- 1 container French-fried Onions (6 Ounce Can)

Preheat oven to 350 F. Prepare Rice-A-Roni according to package directions. While that is cooking, shred/cut up the chicken, removing meat from bones. When Rice-A-Roni is done, add the can of soup and the sour cream, and stir to combine. Add the chicken and mix together. Spread mixture into a sprayed baking dish (9-by-13-inch pan), but you can use what you like for how thick you want it to be) and bake, uncovered, at 350 F for 40 minutes. Remove from oven, cover with the french-friend onions and bake for 5 more minutes.
