#### Paul's letter to Titus on the Island of Crete

### Titus 1:5-16 Doing Good in the Church

Paul's first assignment to Titus was to find godly leaders. Qualified leaders are essential for the church because many false teachers will lead others away from truth and grace. The enemy is active in promoting deception and shepherds of Christ's church must be godly men with discernment who faithfully guard the flock.

# Titus 2:1-10 Good Relationships

Paul's second assignment to Titus was to teach solid doctrine and build healthy relationships. The Gospel has the power to transform societies and cultures, it begins with the faithful lives and godly character of believers in Jesus lived out in our various relationships.

#### Titus 2:11-15 Motivation for Doing Good

In these verses we find that a right understanding of Jesus, who he is, what he has done, and what He will do, is what drives us to doing good.

# Titus 3:1-3 Doing Good in the World

Paul's third assignment to Titus, remind them and keep reminding them to do good in the world. God's grace poured out on us daily should motivate us to reveal His grace to others by doing good.

#### Titus 3:4-8 The Theology of Becoming Good

There is absolutely nothing you can do to earn your salvation. Your life has been saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. So that's the theology of becoming good and doing good. We're not left wondering if we are good enough. Our rescue from spiritual death, eternal separation from God, is not earned by our good works, but only by God's goodness, mercy, and grace.

#### Titus 3:9-15 Devotion to Doing Good

It's relatively easy to talk about God's grace, sing about His love, preach the Gospel, and share its message, but it's in resolving conflict that we prove the Gospel's worth and work. God's grace leads to a life of good works in the church, in our relationships, and in the world.
