

*Sins of Relationships






Shortly after I became a Christian, I was discipled by my high school wrestling coach. He had a group of young men that met with him every single week. He challenged us in a way I had never seen before. He pressed us to not just read our Bibles, but to actually apply it to our lives each week. He started off having us read through the book of James every week, start to finish.

We are going to start off with a five-week series in the book of James. James is one of my favorite books and I am excited to study it together. 

The America I Remember

America of the 1960's is far removed from where we are today. I grew up in a rural, small town setting. A creek, a piano and a country church were pretty much the center of my world. I loved going back to school each year because it meant new books, fresh paper and seeing friends I hadn't seen all summer.



Some would say I led a sheltered, boring life. And that's fair. I had two older sisters, one who got married when I was in third grade and had a son two years later. We took road trips to California when I was young, and I was allowed to ride the Greyhound bus to Oklahoma City many summers so I didn't exactly live in a bubble.

It was in this setting I began to learn and understand at an early age the true meaning of "community". We didn't just know our neighbors in those days -- we knew where they kept their Jell-O. Huh?

One of our favorite childhood stories was about a dear neighbor who, realizing she was missing Jell-O for a certain recipe, came to our house for aid. (It was just over 5 miles into town.) Finding the house unlocked and assuming Mom was in the garden or on some other task, she simply stepped in and helped herself to what she needed. No worries; she repaid us many times over with fresh fried chicken!

We knew our neighbors, we knew their children, their hopes, dreams and fears. And we held many of those hopes, dreams, and fears in common. Did our parents and their neighbors work toward a common goal? You bet - raising good, God-fearing children, working hard to provide for their families, and leaving this world better than they found it.

Our parents' generation pioneered as mentors. They modeled for us and our friends what hard work not only looked like but what the rewards were. They modeled kindness in many forms. I remember popcorn balls for trick-or-treaters who rarely materialized and always saving a cigar box for a certain little neighbor boy to take to school. They modeled sympathy, empathy, and generosity when neighbors or family were hit with hard times.

The thing is, even back then there were people we didn't really "like". There were people who were just "different". And yes, there were people who were just plain "mean". But you know, we just found civil ways to deal with those people.

There were also those who didn't always do the right thing, or make the choices we would make. Like the guys my Dad hired to haul hay from the field to the barn. When questioned about why their trip into town for gas had taken so long, the reply was that they had purchased "gas, oil, and 2 beers". I'm sure my Dad gave them "the look", indicating he didn't approve. He didn't have to go on a rant or turn to social media to let everyone know he had set those guys straight — but I'm also certain they got the message.

And yes, we somehow managed to communicate without the availability of internet, cell phones, or social media. If we couldn't reach the people we needed through the party line telephone, there was always the good ole fashioned face-to-face visit. I was drug on plenty of Sunday afternoon visits to Grandma's house where there was absolutely NOTHING to do except listen to Grandma and my Mom "visit". What did they talk about? I might remember just a bit of it, but man, would I love to replay one of those soundtracks today!

My Dad once traveled to a neighboring town for some "face time" with a guy, maybe about bailing hay. His young daughter informed him that he wasn't home, but she was expecting him back soon. Then she nonchalantly invited him to "come in and help me watch cartoons"! Yeah, those were the days.

Did you ever stop to think that 50 years from now, the 2020's will be "the good 'ole days" for someone? I think a lot about what today's children will remember of these times. Will it be reading a book, getting "the look", or looking for someone who cares? Climbing a tree, being stung by a bee, or living in a world where it's all about me?

And what will they remember of the adults in their life and the examples set for them? Will they remember grace extended, love demonstrated, and grown-ups who intentionally acknowledged them and their value? Or will their childhood be a blur of empty activities, burned out adults, and a society bent on disagreeing about any and everything?

Our journey on this earth is short. What if our most important role is to serve as a guide for those who come behind us?



Cheryl Ciresa

Background:

Cheryl Ciresa was saved at 12 years old - raised in a "broken" home. At the age of 22, Cheryl was involved in an auto accident. It was then that God used a new pastor and his wife to minister to Cheryl through His Word. As she started memorizing scripture and studying His Word, she began to grow in her walk with the Lord. Cheryl says the Lord used verses like Psalms 32:8; Prov 3:5-6; Phil 1:6; among others showing her He had a plan for her life.

Through different circumstances - He led her to Bible college (where Bev & Tom also were). Cheryl felt God leading her into the mission field through United Indian Missions. So, in 1974, she headed to Mexico and stayed for 17 years until 1992.






Cheryl served in Hermosillo, Sonora, Mexico, working with Iglesia Evangelica Marantha Church. She started out teaching Children's Bible Classes in different areas of Hermosillo, some in parks, some in homes, some outside under trees in neighborhoods. She made lots of door-to-door visits. Soon the mothers came to the classes of the children asking to have Bible studies for them. That is when the direction of the Lord changed her focus from the children to the women.



In 1992, the Lord through His Word - Gen 32:9 and other verses and circumstances - led Cheryl to work with 2 different Hispanic churches in Tucson, Arizona. For 7 years, she taught a Bible study on the Pascua Yaqui Indian reservation in South Tucson. She has been there almost 28 years – faithfully working with 3 different churches during this time. Cheryl is currently working with one Hispanic church and is serving under United Ministries Fellowship (UMF).

Current update on the work that continues in Tucson, Arizona:

Since 2015, Cheryl has attended Iglesia Bautista de Tucson. She says her "mission is to share the Gospel as the Lord opens doors, but mostly my heart is in discipling to 'grow the believer' in our Lord Jesus Christ - which in turn they - are witnesses to their own families, friends & neighbors!"



Besides the ladies' Bible studies, Cheryl visits the elderly in her church and shares the Gospel with unsaved contacts she has. Visits are also made to encourage believers and to provide comfort and encouragement through the Word and prayer to those going through difficulties. These visits include patients in the hospital and/or at their home.


Many people are helped at the Christian Family Counseling Center who have nowhere else to go. The generosity of caring people make it possible for them to get the help they want and need.
