Living Water

The water libation ritual, one of many rituals during the Great Feast, was very popular in the Second Temple days. It was the accompanying ceremony of the water drawing, which took place at night when water was drawn from Siloam for the next morning's water libation. Each day for seven consecutive days a priest would walk up a ramp leading to the bronze altar located in the Temple Court and pour a jug full of water into a bowl that drained into the altar. The ceremony of the water drawing was a jubilant occasion. As the ceremony took place, Levite's played lyres, trumpets, harps, cymbals, and other instruments, while other Levites sang. The Mishna states, "He that has never seen the joy of the [ceremony of the water drawing] has never in his life seen joy." (Sukkah 51a)

Even though this ceremony is not practiced today because there is no temple, the liturgy can still be found in some Jewish prayer books. One prayer said during the Sukkot holiday reads "Please God! Those who pour water before you, from the springs of salvation may they draw water, save now and bring salvation now."

Finally, on what was probably the last day of the Great Feast known as Hoshana Raba, (May have occurred one day later on <u>Shemini Atzeret</u>), the climax of the entire week, Jesus made what some believe to be His greatest proclamation, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, 'From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.'" But this He spoke of the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive; for the Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. John 7:37-39

This was no statement secretly whispered in the dark corner. The text says that Jesus "stood" to make His announcement, and He "cried out" meaning He spoke with a loud voice. He wanted everyone to hear the good news. The stunned crowd did hear, and they knew what He meant.

Jesus was declaring that He was Messiah and that everyone who would believe in Him would receive the gift or indwelling of the Holy Spirit, the "living water," not measured in terms of a trickling spring, the Spring of Gihon, but a flowing river-even numerous rivers! Jesus was saying in effect "I am the reality that the water in this ceremony symbolizes - the true life- giver through whom the Holy Spirit is also given." Some may have also been familiar with Ezekiel's prophecy of the Holy Spirit (Ezek. 36:24-27).

A Word from Pastor David Shields

It's election season, which means that hyperbole and fear will be at an all-time high. I saw an election quote, "A democrat will leave nothing unattempted to overturn the government of this country." Another one claimed that the other candidate had "created a reign of terror to promote domestic feud and foreign war." These ads sound similar to what is on our televisions, but they are much older than the 2020 election cycle.

Both of those quotes were actually given during the contested election of 1800 between President John Adams and Democratic-Republican candidate Thomas Jefferson. The election was so heated that most of the quotes and ads run in newspapers would be inappropriate to print in a church newsletter. Both sides were stoking fear that if the other candidate won it would lead to the end of democracy. When Jefferson eventually won many believers were so afraid that they hid their Bibles for fear that they would be confiscated.

I share this for a reason. Elections are often divisive, and fear filled times. Each party uses fear to try and motivate their constituents to vote for their candidate and against the other person. As believers we should not be motivated by fear. We have to resist the urge and pull of attack ads and opinion pieces. We need to rest in one simple, but profound truth: God is on His Throne and He appoints rulers.

Romans 13:1 reminds us that "there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God." There is no election result that could possibly come that would shock God. Whoever wins their local, state, or federal election in November will win because God allowed it. For some of us it will bring joy, for some, sadness. But no matter what happens we need to remember that God is on His throne.

This also means that God appoints the good rulers and the bad. He allowed the dictators, tyrants, and terrible presidents. This doesn't mean that we have to choose political apathy, or that our vote does not matter. But it does mean that we do not need to vote based on fear. We can enter into the ballot box, or mail in our ballot, with hope. Not that our preferred candidate will win, but with the hope that God is King.

The ads every party uses to try and incite fear almost teach a subtle gospel. They tell us that judgement is coming and that the only way to escape is to vote for this particular savior. Avoid falling into that trap. Rest in the love of Jesus, the true Savior. Vote in a way that you will be proud of when you stand before the throne at the end of time. Fear not, Church. God is on His throne. No one can ever vote Him out. (Living Water con't from page 1)

It is important to know something about this water. It was taken from a spring just east of Jerusalem called the Spring of Gihon. This spring may have been used to anoint David's son, Solomon, King of Israel (1 Kings 1:45). King Hezekiah later redirected the water of this spring into the city of Jerusalem through a long underground conduit known as Hezekiah's Tunnel. Within the walls of Jerusalem, the waters of Gihon ran into a pool named the Pool of Siloam.



Waters from the pool of Siloam were used in the ordinance of the red heifer described in Numbers 19, where Moses was instructed to mix "running" (lit. living) water with the ashes of the red heifer. The water had to be fresh, able to give life, not stagnant. This mixture of water and ashes was sprinkled on those who had become unclean to purify them. This same Pool of Siloam is also referred to in the New Testament.

It was to this pool that the Lord Jesus sent a man, blind from birth, to wash off the clay that He had applied to the man's eyes. After washing in the pool, the man received his sight (John 9:6-7).

The Pool of Siloam not only held historical significance, but in Jewish tradition it also had a prophetic connotation. First, the Jewish Scriptures speak of a time when, like water poured "upon him that is thirsty, and floods upon the dry ground," God will pour out His Spirit upon all flesh (Isaiah 44:3). Because the waters of Siloam were used to anoint the kings of the house of David, and that anointing was symbolic of the Holy Spirit coming upon an individual (1 Sam. 16:13), the living waters of Siloam became associated with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Second, this outpouring is to take place during the days of the Messiah, the anointed one, a descendant of King David, through whom salvation will come to Israel. Based on Isaiah 12:3, the Pool of Siloam became known as the "well of salvation" and was associated with the messianic age. Thus, to the Jewish people of the Second Temple days, pouring water on the altar at the Feast of Tabernacles was symbolic of the Holy Spirit poured out during the days of the Messiah.

As I came to the last room in the house, I realized a very pretty, young woman and I were the only ones in the room. With a dazzling smile she asked if my name was Jean Schalit and when I answered, "Yes it is", she said, "I thought so." She went on to say, "You won't remember me, but I worked at the Bank Of Commerce, and you gave me my first devotional book, Jesus Calling." This is the same book that was gifted to all the widows from Kindred Community.

I was very surprised because I didn't remember giving her the book. She went on to tell me how at that time she was at a very low and dark place in her life and didn't know Jesus. She said two co-workers had shared the gospel with her and were very kind to her. She also said those women and the Jesus Calling book helped her find Jesus and her life had totally changed.

She was saved and not long after that met a good man. He came in the room about then, and she introduced me to him. He was saved shortly afterwards and they now attend The Eternal Life Church in Marlow where her husband is in the worship team and she works in the children's ministry. I'm so very glad I went to that sale. What a blessing!

I tell this story to remind myself and others that we never know what very, simple gestures might be used by God to impact another person's life for eternity. Like many pastors I am a big fan of books. The following books are all books you can find on my bookshelf and I would be more than happy to lend them to anyone who would like to read them.





On Earth as it is in Advertising by Sam Van Eman

This is a book that takes a close look at advertising through a Biblical lens. The author describes how advertisements preach a SimGospel that simulates the gospel in order to sell us a product. Now not every single commercial does this, but many do. This is a great read that will not let you watch commercials the same way again.

Vindicating the Vixens by Sandra Glahn

This is a book with multiple authors each taking a chapter on a different woman of the Bible. The book is written to take a second look at some of the women in the Bible who typically get a bad reputation, like Eve and Bathsheba for example. The chapters look closer at the text to see what the Bible actually teaches about them. I found my mind changed frequently based on the exegesis and Bible teaching in this book. The chapter on Rahab was instrumental in helping me understand her plight better for my last sermon in Joshua 2.





The Road by Cormac McCarthy

This is a post-apocalyptic book that follows a father and a son as they travel through the United States. The novel is stripped down, and the father and son are never named. Someone Knows My Name by Lawrence Hill


I recently recommended this book to a fellow TBFer for a "real look" into the sights, sounds, and smells of the reality of slavery. Many in my generation grew up learning the history of slavery in the United States, more or less strictly from a factual standpoint. This book put into a realistic perspective for me the burden of slavery from a human viewpoint.

From her small African village capture and forced walk, to the horrid conditions on the slave ship, one follows Aminata to the United States. Honestly, just that much of the book seared into my brain the sobering injustice of human beings as slaves. The heartache of her story continues with the loss of family members, and her eventual escape. A simple education in reading and writing were her ultimate ticket to freedom.

"This is my name. This is who I am. In the absence of an audience, I will write down my story so that it waits as a restful beast with lungs breathing and heart beating." To be recognized as a "real person" with a name and a "real value" is a basic human instinct.

This book can land heavy on your heart, but is worthwhile for anyone who wants to better understand the human aspects of slavery. You will also be enlightened by a bit of history regarding the settlement of Nova Scotia.
