Unleavened Bread

The Passover is followed by the seven-day Biblical Feast of Unleavened Bread (Exodus 12:14-29). These two feasts were designed to strengthen the faith of God's people in God by reminding them of what He has done for them in the past -- salvation from their slavery in Egypt all the way to the Promised Land. These feasts were to be observed forever with the purpose of continually providing a tangible remembrance of what God did in His great work of redemption. The redemptive work of Christ, which is related to the historical event of the Exodus, must never be forgotten.

The Feast of Unleavened Bread, in particular, is a festival that helps us to focus on replacing sin with righteousness. It is an act of worship that demands preparation, consecration, and full consideration. The removal of leaven from the houses of Israel was symbolic of the cleansing of impure words, thoughts, attitudes, and actions, i.e. sin. Paul reminds the gentiles of this in I Corinthians 5 referencing the feast of unleavened bread -- "keep the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth."

The imagery here is powerful. The Passover – Jesus slain as the Passover lamb. His blood covered our sin and redeemed us from the second death we deserve. After His ultimate sacrifice, there would be no more sacrifices in Israel. Now, 3 days later, Jesus rose from the grave in the middle of the feast of Unleavened Bread while Israel was gathered in Jerusalem for Passover! What the talk must have been!

At the very center of it all - at the very core of the meaning of the Feast of Unleavened Bread - is the all-encompassing truth that the resurrected Jesus Christ, the One who was raised during this spring festival, now lives in every Christian! Let us give thanks and remove the leavening from our lives with preparation, consecration, full consideration.

Church Family,

One of the things that you have allowed me to do as your pastor is participate in a local program called Leadership Duncan. I have been participating in it once a month since the fall and the final session is coming up in May. The program has not just helped me connect with other leaders in our community, but it has really helped me learn more about Duncan. As a relative newcomer to the area, it has been invaluable. Without this program it may have taken me twenty years to learn this much about our area. I am profoundly grateful to get to live in such an incredible community.

Part of the process of this program is that the class members choose a project to give back and help make our community better. Our class took a lot of time, conversations, and even debate on what we could do to serve Duncan best. I am proud to say that our project is focused on renovating the Douglass School and Auditorium. One of the reasons that I am glad we chose this project is that this is something that cannot be accomplished unless we help.

The Douglass School and Auditorium were built in 1939 by the WPA program and are an important part of our town's history. The dream is that this building would be restored to its former glory so it can continue serving as a center for the community. When finalized it can serve as a place to play basketball for those who cannot walk all the way across town to the Simmons Center and so much more. The most immediate need is for a new roof. Other renovations cannot move forward until the roof is fixed.

I know that some of you know the building well and have even danced there. I think this is a beautiful building and love the vision Rudy and Shannon have for the Douglass Center. I would ask you to pray and consider giving towards this project. I think it is an excellent way to love our neighbors and give generously to our community. For those of you who are golfers, there will be a four-person scramble golf tournament on June 11th and the price of a team is \$400. For those (like me) who are not golfers, you can write a check to Leadership Duncan XXV, or write a check to the church and designate it for the Douglass Center.

Seven Ways to Pray for Our Church Elders and Search Committee

- 1. Pray for **Wisdom**. Pray that God would grant the elders of your church the spiritual insight they need to fulfill their duties. It will be to your benefit to be shepherded by men who have been supplied God's supernatural wisdom. (1 Kings 3:9-12)
- 2. Pray for **Vision**. Pray that your elders will be given a vision for the future of the church that is in line with God's vision. Pray that they hear the voice of the Great Shepherd, leading them as they lead others.
- 3. Pray for **Holiness**. Satan is always at work attacking men and women at their weakest points. The elders of your church are probably under a greater attack than most. Pray that they will stand their ground against all of the devil's schemes. Pray that they will desire holiness in their inner being. (Titus 1:7-9; Hebrews 12:14)
- 4. Pray for **Stamina**. Leadership takes a toll. There is always someone or something that needs attention. There are always meetings, phone calls, memos, emails and—did I say—meetings! An elder gets tired in his body and in his spirit. Leading a church can be draining. He desperately needs the strength that God provides to adequately fulfill his ministry. Pray for health, endurance, vigor, and grit for your elders. (1 Corinthians. 15:58; Galatians. 6:9)
- 5. Pray for **Knowledge**. Pray for an ever-growing understanding of God's Word that he may be able to find the right answers to the inquiries raised by his people concerning doctrine, sound advice, and godly counsel. (Titus 2:7-8; Colossians 1:9-12)
- 6. Pray for **Unity**. Pray they will live a life worthy of the calling they have received to be completely humble and gentle; to be patient, bearing with one another in love; making every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. (Ephesians 4:1-3)
- 7. Pray for **Humility**. Pray for our elders as they set the example for us to follow both in humility and gentleness. That they would not "lord-over" but serve in humility. (Ephesians 4; 1 Peter 5:2-4)

Abby Johnson has always had a fierce determination to help women in need. It was this desire that both led Abby to a career with Planned Parenthood, our nation's largest abortion provider, and caused her to flee the organization and become an outspoken advocate for the pro-life movement. During her eight years with Planned Parenthood, Abby quickly rose in the organization's ranks and became a clinic director. She was increasingly disturbed by what she witnessed. Abortion was a product Planned Parenthood was selling, not an unfortunate necessity that they fought to decrease. All of that changed on Sept. 26, 2009, when Abby was asked to assist with an ultrasound-guided abortion. She watched in horror as a 13-week baby fought, and ultimately lost, its life at the hand of the abortionist. At that moment, the full realization of what abortion was and what she had dedicated her life to washed over Abby, and a dramatic transformation took place.

Desperate and confused, Abby sought help from a local pro-life group. She swore that she would begin to advocate for life in the womb and expose abortion for what it truly is.



Like many pastors I am a big fan of books. The following books are all books you can find on my bookshelf and I would be more than happy to lend them to anyone who would like to read them





Possibility of Prayer by John Starke

This is one of the best books about prayer I have read in a long time. I usually avoid them because they either come off as unattainable, or so theological that they aren't helpful. Reading this book felt like sitting down with a pastor who was trying to help me pray. It is a deeply pastoral and practical work. It shows how a good prayer life is possible even in the mundane moments of ordinary prayers.

American Jezebel by Eve LaPlante

This is a short biography of the life of Anne Hutchinson, who was convicted of being a heretic in early colonial America. She is someone I had heard about some while studying American church history, but never in any detail. Her story is fascinating and compelling. I found myself sympathetic towards her while also getting greater details of her theological missteps. The best part of this book is that it helped remind me that the early American church was not some utopian ideal. They had plenty of widespread and systemic sin issues as well.





A Man Called Ove by Frederick Backman

This is a book I read by a non-Christian who is quickly becoming one of my favorite authors. It is about a curmudgeonly fifty-nine-year-old man who has recently been forced into retirement. He is a cranky neighbor with a short fuse who loves to correct everyone, everywhere on everything they are doing wrong. It ended up being a delightful tale about loving our neighbors.

"Until, that is, that wonderful day when my husband was visited by an angel. It scared him half to death, but the messenger Gabriel brought an unbelievable message: We were to have a child at last! When my time had come, I brought forth a beautiful baby boy whom we named My name is" (Luke 1).
